We delivered a project with NHS England that explores healthcare inequalities for CYP with complex needs...

There are children 6000 and young people in residential special schools in the UK with learning disabilities, autism or both.

Some students find it **hard**, or even **impossible** to partake in certain

healthcare tests due to communication challenges or sensory difficulties, meaning conditions can go undiagnosed.



NHS England have committed to taking steps to close these inequality gaps for CYP in special schools, with a particular focus on vision, dentistry and hearing.

Hearing Checks in Residential Special Schools Seashell/NHS Feasibility Study

Specialists at Seashell explored a **behavioural approach** to prepare



students for a hearing check, **reducing fear**, **anxiety** and the need for costly medical intervention.



Seashell's Principal Audiologist and Speech & Language Therapist created a **training package**

that enabled highly familiar education staff to upskill and deliver **meaningful** hearing checks to their students.

The project's learning will contribute to a national programme to develop a service model and toolkit for the wider roll out of hearing checks in residential special school/colleges in England.
