Technology equipment is vital to enable our students to communicate and learn, with specialist apps and websites supporting their daily progress and achievements.

Physiotherapy Equipment £49,011

Physiotherapy at Seashell takes a 'person centred approach' for the health and wellbeing of children and young people with complex disabilities helping them to access education, maximise their functional independence and fulfil their physical potential. As all our young adults have communication difficulties, exercise also makes an important contribution to their mental health and well-being. We have amazing results from students who work with our physiotherapists, particularly in terms of reducing spasticity, increasing mobility, and improving confidence and self-esteem.

Breaking Boundaries Activity Break £39,000

Through attendance at the Activity break we aim to promote inclusion, encourage independence, and build self-confidence through the safe provision of adventurous activities at Bendrigg Trust. As well as being a lot of fun, it also gives disabled young people exercise, and helps them improve stamina and co-ordination even if the young person has limited movement or profound learning

disabilities. The young people can take part in many activities usually not accessible to them such as rock climbing, abseiling and canoeing.

Our family social events provide a special time for all our Seashell families to come on site in a relaxed environment to enjoy and share time with their child or young adult. Through these events families can have time and space to talk to other families, promoting friendships therefore strengthening their support networks and decreasing the isolation that many of our families find themselves experiencing.

Children's Able and Disabled Sports Programme

Our award-winning CADS programme offers a wide range of fully inclusive activities as well as health and wellbeing options during school holidays and through weekly clubs. We offer holiday clubs, a Saturday club and specialist activities (climbing, football, swimming etc.) on a weekly basis. We ensure that the activities on offer can be accessed by all young people no matter what their ability or disability, and one to one support can be provided for those with more complex needs.

Impact

CADS provides the opportunity for children to access high quality, inclusive physical activity and well-being events supporting their physical health and well-being. Attending CADS events improves confidence and self-esteem and

enables friendships and social interaction that many fail to obtain due to lack of opportunities. One to one support provides families with the knowledge that their child will be fully supported and safe whilst also giving them respite that is often desperately needed.

Projects

New Horticulture Outdoor Learning area £40,000

Using a horticulture-based learning programme is one of the greatest motivators for our students and brings immeasurable benefits including increased self-confidence, greater interaction and exploration. Having a programme where activities are focussed and fixed has also enabled students to increase their mental flexibility. The current site houses outdoor buildings that are not fit for purpose and is across the campus away from the main school building which presents huge challenges for our students to transition to the outdoor learning area.
